

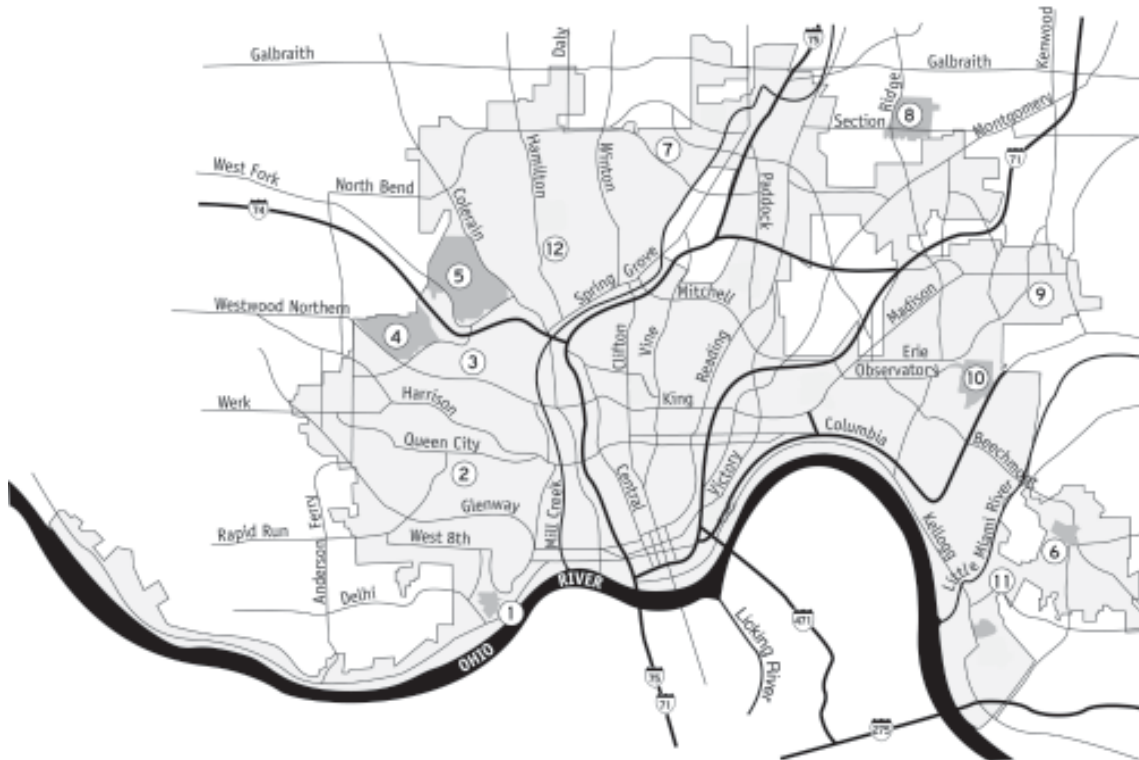

Field Trips to a Cincinnati Park or Nature Center

The Cincinnati Parks system, with more than 150 parks and greenspaces, provides many opportunities for scouts. You can lead your den on a self-guided trail hike at one of the Cincinnati Parks any day of the week from dawn to dusk or schedule a Naturalist-led program at your neighborhood park or Nature Center.

There are four Nature Centers conveniently located across the city. (see far right for listing). Each Center has a park or wildlife preserve and knowledgeable on-site Naturalist staff. Nature Center buildings are open most weekdays for scheduled programming.

Programs can be correlated to Cub Scout achievements, electives and badges as noted to the right. Most programs are scheduled for after-school hours. For weekend scout programs offered seasonally, visit the Parks website at: www.cincinnati-parks.com
